## **KEY IDEAS**

- An advantage to live streaming is it allows both in-person and online worship to take place simultaneously.
- For time-strapped worship teams/pastors, it's hard to argue with this obvious advantage.
- Your online members get to worship in real time with your in-person congregation.
- Some congregations say they like having everyone worshiping at the same time.
- If your only choice is streaming a worship service live, do that over choosing nothing.
- The minuses to streaming live are that you share a service designed for in-person worship online.
- Live streaming means you must default to your in-person worshipers' needs.
- Live streaming limits when people can view the service.
- The downside is that pre-recorded online worship takes more time and more resources.
- Recording the service live clearly takes more time and energy.
- Do you need to be offering a full online worship experience, or would a brief devotion, maybe with music, be a more manageable way of reaching online audiences?
- If you do plan to edit, there is editing software for both Mac and pc.
- For Mac users, the basic <u>iMovie</u> is simple drop-and-drag technology that is easy to learn and use.
- Mac operating professionals use more expensive software like <u>Final Cut Pro</u> or <u>Adobe</u> Premier.
- These are much more difficult to learn and master and cost significantly more to own, so this is not an ideal option for those just beginning.
- PC Users have more options, but there are not really any good options for beginners;
   Movavi Video Editor Plus and Corel VideoStudio.
- Adobe Premiere Pro for PC is available, but it offers a steeper learning curve.
- Whether you live stream or pre-record; a good practice is to engage those who
  comment on the service; commenting assures that those watching online feel they are a
  part of the service.
- This engagement is critical to successful online worship.
- Integrate your social media so people know where and how to find your church online each week.
